Loans for energy efficiency

I heard from Matt Stearns, the branch manager at Citizens Bank that Citizens offers a loan program that it is specifically for energy-saving improvements to one's home. Up to \$3,000 the interest rate is 1%, and up to \$10,000 it is 3%. with (I think) a five to ten year payback. My banker told me that a \$3,000 loan at 1% paid back over five years would be about \$50 a month. If you are interested, you can get more accurate information from Citizens at 539-1220.

New Hampshire Inter-Tribal Native American Council Presents a 15th Annual Tamworth Campgrounds and Grandmother Bev Newell Memorial Pow Wow and Gathering on May 16-18 at the Tamworth Family Campgrounds Located on Depot Road, off of Route 16 in Tamworth NH. American Indians and Aboriginal People from all across the United States and parts of Canada will gather together with us for this family oriented weekend. About 25 traders' booths from all over the United States and possibly parts of Canada will display and sell their wares. You'll find everything from Indian frybread (yummy), to antique beads, exquisite Pendleton blankets, books, artwork and craft supplies Native American Indian Arts and Crafts from artwork to pottery to intricately designed jewelry and leather goods. We will have traditional Native American Drums, Dancers, Singers, Storytelling, Jewelry, and Crafts through out the day. Rain or Shine. Festivities start on Friday night with the Mourners Feast from 6 P.M. to 8 P.M. (this starts the one year long period of mourning to those next of kin of whom have passed away over the last 12 months.) There may be several flute players playing their instruments from 10:00am to 11:30am on Saturday and Sunday morning. Grand Entry both Saturday and Sunday 12 Noon. Rain or Shine. Ending time on Saturday is 5 pm. Second Grand Entry will be at 7 pm Ending on Saturday night between 9 to 9:30 pm. All children under 16 years of age or under MUST be accompanied by an adult after 9:00 PM. And back to their sites by 10:00 PM. Ending time on Sunday will be between 4 and 5 pm.
